

Words are extremely important in a relationship.

Sexual talk can be difficult for some people but communication is important to having a great sex life. If you are a couple that have a difficult time discussing your sexual relationship, discuss the following questions with your spouse:

1. Do you believe in soul mates?
2. Do you believe in love at first sight?
3. What do you consider to be romantic?
4. What have you learned about love?
5. What was the most significant thing about your first kiss with your spouse?
6. The most romantic thing your spouse has ever done was...
7. The most memorable moment spent with your spouse was...
8. What are the three best things about your spouse?
9. What is your favorite form of foreplay?
10. What is your favorite way to kiss?
11. What is your favorite sexual position?
12. What is your favorite place to make love?
13. What is your favorite music to make love by?
14. What is your favorite time of day to make love?
15. How do you like to be touched sexually?

Develop your own special love language. You can give words a special meaning that only you and your spouse are aware of.

Talk during your sexual encounter. Most people do not hesitate to say what they don't like during sexual intercourse but it is also important to communicate when your spouse is pleasing you. Plus, a great deal of excitement enters the bedroom when a husband and wife talk to each other during the sexual encounter. For example, when the husband kisses and caresses the wife's breasts it is exciting for both of them. Imagine if suddenly, she says just how much she likes his kisses and caresses then the experience becomes more exciting. Your spouse need to her that he is doing a good job.
